Communication

- Consultation with Stakeholders prior to project initiation
- > Open dialogue throughout the project
- Cooperation with all stakeholders including onsite project team

Preparation and Planning

- > Ample time for prep and planning
- > Appropriate method of logistics
- > Supplies for any circumstance





STRATEGIES

Appropriate Technical Approach

- > Involve stakeholders
- > Involve specialists
- > Summer vs. winter
- > On-site treatment of impacted soil
- > Risk Assessment if possible
