

Supplemental Guidance on Site-Specific Risk Assessments in Alberta

Alberta Environment and Parks has released the Supplemental Guidance on Site-Specific Risk Assessments in Alberta. Site-specific risk assessment (SSRA) is offered as an option under Alberta's Contaminated Sites Policy Framework. This document provides information on Alberta's expectations with respect to the Tier 2 site-specific risk assessment option, recommended guidance documents that are accepted in Alberta, and an outline for information required in reports submitted to the Government of Alberta. This guidance will help responsible parties better understand the regulatory requirements for site closure under the Tier 2 site-specific risk assessment option.
