

Regulation of PFAS in Alberta

Summary

- Tier 1 and Tier 2 Soil and Groundwater Remediation Guidelines (January 2023)
 - PFOS & PFOA
- Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. E-12
 - Prohibited releases and reporting
- Increased Municipal Water Testing Drinking water

Medium	PFOS	PFOA
Soil (fine)	0.010 - 0.070 mg/kg	-
Soil (coarse)	0.010 - 0.14 mg/kg	-
Groundwater – Soil (fine)	0.00060 mg/L	0.00020 mg/L
Groundwater – Soil (coarse)	0.00060 mg/L	0.00020 mg/L


No person shall release or permit the release into the environment of a substance in an amount, concentration or level or at a rate that causes or may cause significant adverse effects (EPEA, s. 109(2))

Regulation of PFAS in the United States

US Federal

- Historically emphasized volunteer-based approach
 - PFAS Stewardship program
- Current lack of comprehensive regulation
 - Failed implementation of the *PFAS Action Act 2019* and *PFAS Action Act 2021*
- Recent Developments:
 - Toxic Substances Control Act
 - Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 ("CERCLA")
 - Safe Drinking Water Act

Regulation of PFAS in the United States

US States

- Regulatory regimes vary significantly between states.
- California
 - Product Safety: juvenile products: chemicals: PFAS infants and children's products
 - Product safety: textile articles: PFAS clothing and household textiles
 - Cosmetic products: safety cosmetic products
 - Proposition 65 "clear and reasonable warnings"
- Maine
 - Consumer products
 - Reporting requirements
- o Minnesota
 - Reporting requirements
 - Phased prohibitions on the sale and distribution of products intentionally containing PFAS


