



FCSAP Phase V Demand Forecast 2026-2031

The Federal Contaminated Sites Action Plan (FCSAP) is a government-wide program led by Environment and Climate Change Canada, to reduce risks to human health and the environment and associated financial liabilities. In Budget 2024, the FCSAP was renewed with funding of \$1.6 billion from 2025-2030. This presentation will provide an overview of the FCSAP nationally and regionally in Eastern Canada, as well as the current forecasts for private sector support starting April 1, 2026. We will also discuss the various procurement approaches, including ways to encourage participation of Indigenous companies and highlighting ways for companies to find opportunities to bid on Federal Contaminated Sites contracts.
